

#### **About Our Worship**

The gospel is the good news about what Jesus did to be the Savior for sinners. It is also the power of God—the very thing he uses to work faith in our hearts and transform our lives. Therefore, gospel-centered worship places the gospel in central focus. This order of service is called the liturgy. In the message, in specially selected Scripture readings, and in carefully crafted songs, prayers, and creeds, the liturgy proclaims the good news about Jesus from start to finish. Gospel-centered worship is also designed to include the participation of the entire assembly (including children).

#### The Season | The Sundays in Lent |

The word Lent comes from an Old English word for spring ("lengten," the time of the year when the days grow longer). For the last 1700 years, the Church has set aside the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter as a time of special preparation. It is a time of repentance and renewal.

During Lent, our rejoicing is muted as we remember our Lord's suffering and death. But it is with a purpose: we know that the Lord who died took up his life again on Easter Sunday morning. So our 40 days of Lent are ones lived in the certain hope of the resurrection. (For the precise counters in our congregation, the Church speaks of 40 days of Lent because they did not count the Sundays, which retained their significance as "little Easters.")

The color of the season is purple. Purple is the ancient color of royalty. We have this kind of king: he wore of crown of thorns, and carried a cross for us. Thanks be to God!

#### Today's Theme | The Depth of God's Love |

The way God demonstrates his love is sometimes confusing and certainly backwards to the world. He demonstrates the depth of his love in ways that apparently weak and strange: through a snake on a tree and a man on a cross. He gives it to people who don't deserve it—to rebellious and ungrateful people, to those who are blind, to those who live in darkness. And to understand why this is, you need to understand God himself. Because love is not just a feeling that God has. God himself is love. And to know God is to know the depth of God's love and to know love itself.

# **GATHERING RITE FOR LENT**

Lent is a more pensive and contemplative season of the Church Year. For centuries Christians have adapted the worship service in order to focus hearts on our need for Christ's perfect life that led to his sacrificial death and resurrection. This opening uses a rooted Lutheran hymn text and an adapted ancient melody in order to guide the worshipper to confess sins and receive full and free forgiveness found in the gospel of Jesus Christ our Lord

#### **Invocation**


- In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, let us confess our sins to him and plead for his mercy.





#### Children's Message

#### First Reading | Numbers 21:4-9 |

"<sup>4</sup> They traveled from Mount Hor along the route to the Red Sea, to go around Edom. But the people grew impatient on the way; <sup>5</sup> they spoke against God and against Moses, and said, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? There is no bread! There is no water! And we detest this miserable food!"

<sup>6</sup> Then the LORD sent venomous snakes among them; they bit the people and many Israelites died. <sup>7</sup> The people came to Moses and said, "We sinned when we spoke against the LORD and against you. Pray that the LORD will take the snakes away from us." So Moses prayed for the people.

<sup>8</sup> The LORD said to Moses, "Make a snake and put it up on a pole; anyone who is bitten can look at it and live." <sup>9</sup> So Moses made a bronze snake and put it up on a pole. Then when anyone was bitten by a snake and looked at the bronze snake, they lived.

#### Second Reading | 1 John 4:7-21|

<sup>7</sup> Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. <sup>8</sup> Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. <sup>9</sup> This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. <sup>10</sup> This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. <sup>11</sup> Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. <sup>12</sup> No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

<sup>13</sup> This is how we know that we live in him and he in us: He has given us of his Spirit. <sup>14</sup> And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. <sup>15</sup> If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in them and they in God. <sup>16</sup> And so we know and rely on the love God has for us.

God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them. <sup>17</sup> This is how love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment: In this world we are like Jesus. <sup>18</sup> There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.

<sup>19</sup> We love because he first loved us. <sup>20</sup> Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. <sup>21</sup> And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister.

#### The Gospel

L The Gospel according to John, chapter nine.

As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. <sup>2</sup> His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

- <sup>3</sup> "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. <sup>4</sup> As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. <sup>5</sup> While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."
- <sup>6</sup> After saying this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man's eyes. <sup>7</sup> "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam" (this word means "Sent"). So the man went and washed, and came home seeing.
- <sup>13</sup> They brought to the Pharisees the man who had been blind. <sup>14</sup> Now the day on which Jesus had made the mud and opened the man's eyes was a Sabbath. <sup>15</sup> Therefore the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. "He put mud on my eyes," the man replied, "and I washed, and now I see."
- <sup>16</sup> Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath."


But others asked, "How can a sinner perform such signs?" So they were divided.

<sup>17</sup> Then they turned again to the blind man, "What have you to say about him? It was your eyes he opened."

The man replied, "He is a prophet."

- $^{34}$  To this they replied, "You were steeped in sin at birth; how dare you lecture us!" And they threw him out.
- <sup>35</sup> Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, and when he found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"
  - <sup>36</sup> "Who is he, sir?" the man asked. "Tell me so that I may believe in him."
  - <sup>37</sup> Jesus said, "You have now seen him; in fact, he is the one speaking with you."
  - <sup>38</sup> Then the man said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him.
- <sup>39</sup> Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, so that the blind will see and those who see will become blind."
- L This is the Gospel of the Lord.

#### Confession of Faith | Nicene Creed |

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one Holy Christian and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

#### Introduction to the Lord's Supper

L Everyone ought to examine their hearts before partaking of the Lord's Supper.

1 Corinthians 11:28

I confessed my transgressions to the Lord and he forgave the guilt of my sin.

Psalm 32:5

Everyone ought to recognize the true body and blood of the Lord in this Supper.

1 Corinthians 11:29

The bread that we break and the cup that we bless are a participation in the body and blood of Christ.

1 Corinthians 10:16

- Those partaking of the Lord's Supper are to be united in fellowship as one body.
- Because there is one loaf, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.

1 Corinthians 10:17

#### The Words of Institution

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, it remembrance of me.


