Gospel-centered worship is also designed to include the participation of the entire assembly (including children).

Service Notes ~The Festival of the Holy Trinity ~

Today the Christian Church celebrates that we believe in a triune God. Triune comes from the Latin *Tri* (three) and *unus* (one). Our God is triune because he tells that he is three persons–Father, Son, and Holy Spirit–but only one God.

In the fourth century, two great errors arose in the church that undermined the biblical teaching concerning God. One error denied that God's Son and the Holy Spirit are of one being or Godhead with the Father. The other error denied that Jesus Christ is true God and true man in one person.

While these errors reared their ugly head, God raised up a man named Athanasius to defend his Church against such heresies. Athanasius was a staunch defender of the Christian faith. He wrote what became known as the Athanasian Creed, which continues to serve the Christian Church as a standard of the truth. This creed (a statement of belief) declares that whoever rejects the doctrine of the Trinity and the doctrine of Christ is without saving faith. We will recite a selected portion of the creed this morning.

The Festival of the Holy Trinity marks the beginning of the second half of the church year. Since Advent, God's people have concentrated on the life of Christ. For the next six months, we will concentrate on the great teachings of Christ.

First Reading | Isaiah 6:1-8 |

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³ And they were calling to one another:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory."

⁴ At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

⁵ "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty."

Second Reading | Romans 8:12-17|


¹² Therefore, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation—but it is not to the flesh, to live according to it. ¹³ For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live.

¹⁴ For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. ¹⁵ The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, *"Abba*, Father." ¹⁶ The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. ¹⁷ Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

The Gospel

L The Gospel according to John, chapter three.

Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. ²He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him."

³ Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again."

⁴ "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!"

⁵ Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. ⁶ Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. ⁷ You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' ⁸ The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."

⁹ "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked.

¹⁰ "You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? ¹¹ Very truly I tell you, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. ¹² I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man. ¹⁴ Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, ¹⁵ that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.

Sermon | *Mysterious Simplicity* |

John 3:1-17

Personal Sermon Notes

Confession of Faith | The Athanasian Creed³ |

- Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith.
 Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever.
 Now this is the true Christian faith:
- ☑ We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being. For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct, but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.
- What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit. The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; the Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; the Father is eternal the Son eternal, and the Holy Spirit eternal;
- Yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal, just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who in infinite...So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; yet they are not three Gods, but one God. And within this Trinity all three persons are coequal and coeternal, so that in every way, as stated before, all three persons are to be worshiped as one God and one God worshiped as three persons. Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.
- L It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ took on human flesh. Now this is the true Christian faith:
- G We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man. He is God eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and he is man, born in time from the nature of his mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh, equal to the Father as to his deity, less than the Father as to his humanity; and though he is both God and man, Christ is not two persons but one.
- L He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead. He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- **C** This is the true Christian faith. Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe cannot be saved. Amen.

³ This creed is named after St. Athanasius, a staunch defender of the Christian faith in the fourth century. It was prepared to assist the Church in combating two errors that undermined biblical teaching. One error denied that God's Son and the Holy Spirit are of one being or Godhead with the Father. The other error denied that Jesus Christ is true God and true man in one person.
