In the message, in specially selected Scripture readings, and in carefully crafted songs, prayers, and creeds, the liturgy proclaims the good news about Jesus from start to finish. Gospel-centered worship is also designed to include the participation of the entire assembly (including children).

Advent is a Latin word that means "coming." The season of Advent is the four-week period before Christmas that the church uses to remember the "coming" of Christ as the savior of the world.

## Today's Theme | The Forerunner Points |


So far this Advent, we've looked at the John the Baptist and how he prepared people: through a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. We've looked at how, through his preparation, he pointed people to the Christ. And today, we are introduced to a different character in the Advent narrative: Mary. She was prepared by another messenger for the coming of God's Son. But this messenger was an angel. She was prepared



for the coming of God's Son by being told she would give birth to him. And in Mary, we are given a picture of the best preparation for Christmas: a readiness to receive.




# **ORDER OF SERVICE**

Normally, no hymn of praise is sung during Advent and Lent. This practice accentuates the solemn and penitential nature of these seasons. This Advent, the Gloria is replaced by the gathering rite for the season. At the heart of this gathering rite is thought of waiting. The season of Advent is marked by waiting in anticipation for the coming of God's Son in flesh and blood to be our Savior. It is in him we hope. It is for him we wait. It is to him we pray, "Come quickly, Lord."


O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.



## First Reading | 2 Samuel 7:8-16 |

<sup>8</sup> "Now then, tell my servant David, 'This is what the LORD Almighty says: I took you from the pasture, from tending the flock, and appointed you ruler over my people Israel. <sup>9</sup> I have been with you wherever you have gone, and I have cut off all your enemies from before you. Now I will make your name great, like the names of the greatest men on earth. <sup>10</sup> And I will provide a place for my people Israel and will plant them so that they can have a home of their own and no longer be disturbed. Wicked people will not oppress them anymore, as they did at the beginning <sup>11</sup> and have done ever since the time I appointed leaders over my people Israel. I will also give you rest from all your enemies.

"The Lord declares to you that the Lord himself will establish a house for you: <sup>12</sup> When your days are over and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring to succeed you, your own flesh and blood, and I will establish his kingdom. <sup>13</sup> He is the one who will build a house for my Name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. <sup>14</sup> I will be his father, and he will be my son. <sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Advent Wreath is a combination of two very common symbols: light and the fir tree. From the early centuries of Christianity, it has been the practice to represent Christ by a burning candle. The fir tree has a long history of religious use. No doubt the Advent Wreath was suggested by the Christmas tree. It seems that the Advent Wreath originated a few hundred years ago among the Lutherans of eastern Germany. A wreath of evergreens, made in various sizes, was either suspended from the ceiling or placed on a table. Four candles representing the four Sundays of Advent were fastened to the wreath. Eventually the use of the Advent Wreath became widespread and moved also from the home into the church. The general symbolism of the Advent Wreath lies in the growing light of the wreath, increasing each week as we approach the birthday of Jesus, the Light of the world.

### **The Gospel**


L The Gospel, according to Luke, chapter one.


### Confession of Faith | Apostles' Creed |




